At that same time, Frederick Law Olmsted, the renowned landscape architect responsible for designing Central Park in New York City, headed west to California and a post as Superintendent of the Mariposa mining estate. The demand for his administrative and planning expertise was more than even he could have predicted. Besides being appointed as the frst President of the Yosemite Valley Commission, Olmsted accepted the unique challenge of designing Oakland's new Mountain View Cemetery.
